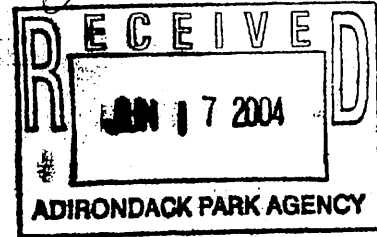

on any of our properties period.

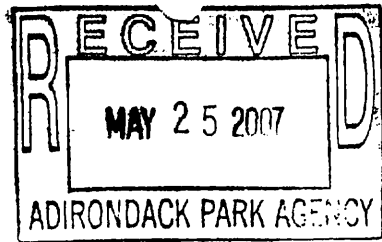
We would hate to spoil the

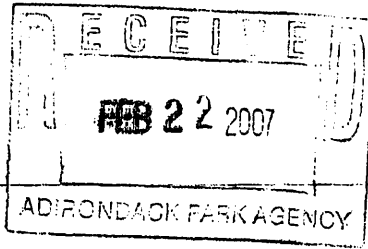
